A New Goal - Retirement

Many individuals look eagerly forward to the day in which they can retire from their present employment in one way or another.

At PMI, we are looking to retire - retire our mortgage debt in 2018.

First, a bit of history: In early 2001, following a search for a new location for the Chambersburg Center, the Lord directed the Board to a property at 338 Lincoln Way East that was available for purchase. The Board voted in March of that year to purchase the property for \$130,000.

Over the past 17 years, PMI has been able to rent out the back portion of the facility to assist with mortgage payments and building improvements and repairs. Donations specifically toward the debt have also been received periodically and added to regular monthly payments.

The mortgage is now down to \$20,000! With your help, we can bring the amount down to \$0 by the end of the year and phase 2 can begin. Phase 2 includes upgrading and renovating the property to better serve our clients and

their needs.

This is SO doable! With over 2000 addresses on our mailing list, an average of \$10 in a special donation would cover the mortgage balance.

Pregnancy Ministries' Volunteer Training

A woman struggling with an unplanned pregnancy may feel confused and scared - not knowing what to do. A free pregnancy test and ultrasound confirmation, a program to help with material needs, education on pre-natal and baby issues, and sharing the Good News of the Gospel can be the support needed to give her direction and empower her to carry her baby.

With the training provided through Pregnancy Ministries, volunteers can meet with young women and give them support and education they need. We are also looking for men to work with young dads who come through our doors.

For those who feel inclined to serve in other ways, we have volunteers who launder clothes, wash furniture items, do routine maintenance, weed, sweep and clean.

With more volunteers, we can serve more women and be the first choice for women in unplanned pregnancies. From meeting with clients and answering the phones to sorting donations and weeding flowerbeds, each volunteer's work is important.

I was recently contacted by the counselor of a local middle school about our services. I was able to present our mission and share numerous brochures concerning our services here at the Waynesboro Center. It was interesting to me that the mother of the young man involved had given birth to him when she was 14 and now he is 14 having a baby.

I am grateful for the doors this opportunity will open within our school system and look forward to working with them in the future.

What's Happening in Shippensburg

A Little Knowledge

It's called *Softouch*; the non-medical, quick, natural procedure used to perform an abortion in minutes, virtually removing all the burdens of more conventional abortion methods. Advertisers compare the procedure to a PAP test and the results to a miscarriage. This "procedure" is done by inserting a tube and applying pressure that simply releases a late period......a natural release.

Where do I start? First of all anytime a tube is inserted anywhere and pressure applied is considered invasive. It is done in the comfort of your doctor's exam room with a supportive companion versus a maybe not so nice room and a loud suction machine. According to what I have read many women are to be able to leave the office feeling ready to resume their normal activities with no restrictions. Only one visit versus three with the abortion pill.

This was invented by a Harvardtrained doctor and being marketed as a part of mainstream primary abortion care.

The way I see it, nothing has changed. Words are being used to make the procedure seem *natural*like being treated for the flu. When the girl leaves the office the result is still the same, a baby has lost his or her life. The consequences still need to be dealt with at some point in time ... and that doesn't feel so soft.

Pray with us that hearts and eyes will be open to the truth. It doesn't matter how "soft", convenient, quick or easy it may seem, the reality of abortion is still the same.

InsideOut Dad

A curriculum designed specifically for incarcerated fathers, the goal is to connect inmate fathers to their families and develop pro-fathering attitudes.

InsideOut Dad, a series of sessions on parenting for incarcerated fathers, is held every other Saturday at the Franklin Country Jail. The leaders, Jason Baker and Larry Rutter, have been encouraged by the attendance.

A total of 118 jail residents attended at least one session. Seven men completed the entire curriculum. Others came for two to six of the classes. Although the seven who completed are only 6% of the total attendees, it should be noted that, being a county jail, inmates frequently become eligible for work release, are released or moved to other facilities.

Our prayer is that each one would be touched in some way even if they only attended one session.
