Ultrasound services were provided to abortion-minded. Added protections include only meeting with one client at a time, screening and taking temperatures before anyone enters the building, disinfecting high touch areas frequently and between clients, and, of course, wearing masks and social distancing. .

We all have a responsibility to keep the most vulnerable among us safe. We will stay compliant with state and federal guidelines as we serve our mothers and babies.

#### Isolation

As we stayed home, away from others who may have been carrying germs, we stayed safe. We also saw the benefit on our medical community as we "flattened the curve".

Those who enjoy solitude may have enjoyed this time more than those that thrive from community. As an introvert, I enjoyed it, but I missed seeing family and meeting with my church community. We all were challenged to find other ways of connecting, communicating and doing the essentials of living, like grocery shopping, work and church.

Just like too much of anything, isolation can cause harm. When we are physically, emotionally or spiritually struggling, isolation can be dangerous; separating us from those who can help. Each of us is made in the image of God, who is a union of three persons and encourages us through His word how

important community is for all of us. In Hebrews He tells us not to neglect meeting together as a body, in Proverbs we read there is wisdom in many counselors, and throughout the New Testament we are encouraged to do the "one anothers" of Scripture.

Individuals who experience abortion often find themselves in isolation. They don't want others to know about their experience for fear of rejection and may feel distant from God and unforgivable. This can cause great emotional pain and make them very vulnerable.

At PMI, through our abortion recovery ministry Restore, we long to share compassion and hope so men and women can find freedom and restoration. Please pray that God would give men and women courage to break their silence and isolation and to reach out for help. Isolated or not, let's be creative in faithfully being members of one another (Romans 12).

# Why I am Here

As I write this article, I am in between trainings. I went to my didactic conference in October 2019. I was to start my hands-on training in January, but we lacked training "models". Disappointing, but figured it was God's timing and it would be more time to orient and study.

My training rescheduled for the second and third week of March had plenty of models signed up. The second week was cancelled due to the COVID lockdown and rescheduled for July 20th. This has given me opportunity for more study and orienting to the workings of PMI. Also I was able to take an online refresher course similar to the one I attended in October...at no cost.

So far, the ultrasounds that I have been able to assist with but not perform have me very excited and have confirmed that this is where I am supposed to be.

There was one abortion minded client that, once she saw her baby (which was the size of a grain of sand), she started crying. Two weeks later she was able to come back and see a beating heart. She again cried and had already started prenatal vitamins.

A different abortion minded client who already had her appointment for an abortion came in. She was further along than she expected and after seeing her baby clearly move around said, "I don't think I can go through with it".

This is why we are here, why I am here.

Work began on having some legal and practical questions answered in an effort to move forward. Then came—Covid-19! With the "world" being shutdown and turned askew, the process was put on a backburner.
