"But woe to you Pharisees! For you tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass by justice and the love of God..." Luke 11:42

Throughout the Bible, God's severest judgment falls upon those who profess to be His people, but who oppress or ignore the plight of the helpless and needy. God says to Judah:

"Alas, sinful nation, a people laden with iniquity, a brood of evildoers..." Isaiah 1:14

He then calls them to repentance,

"Wash yourselves, make yourselves clean; put away the evil doings from before my eyes. Cease to do evil. Learn to do good. Seek justice. Reprove your oppressor. Defend the fatherless. Plead for the widow." Isaiah 1:16, 17

To the nation of Israel, God says:

"I hate, I despise your feast days, and I do not savor your sacred assemblies. Take away from me the noise of your songs, for I will not hear the melody of your stringed instruments! But let justice run down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream." Amos 5:21-24

It is much easier to merely go through the motions of religious observance than to invest yourselves in the lives of people. The Lord Jesus hates compromise and lukewarmness in His church. He tells us to repent of such sin.

The spirit of the world is to live for yourself and pursue your own pleasures. True Biblical religion includes giving yourself for others and especially those in need.

"Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world." James 1:27





STDs During Pregnancy

Many women don't know that having a sexually transmitted disease during pregnancy can complicate the pregnancy and have serious health effects on both mother and baby. Many STDs are "silent" and have no symptoms so they may not know they are infected. In addition, many women are not getting in to see a doctor until the beginning of the second trimester. Untreated infections for pregnant women have been linked to premature labor and birth, low birth weight, and eye and lung problems. These infections can even infect an infant during birth as it passes through the birth canal.

Testing and treating pregnant women for STDs is one of the

services we offer at PMI. We want to prevent health complications to mother and baby that may otherwise happen. It is so easy to collect the sample while we are doing the pregnancy test. We partner with the Department of Health; we collect the sample and send it to the lab. They do the testing and send us the results. If it is positive for an infection, we then treat them. We treat under the guidance of our medical director using CDC guidelines. Everything is free to the client. It is so important to know this information at the beginning of a pregnancy for the best health outcomes for mother and baby.

How Does PMI Help Non-Clients?

PMI has been so very blessed with lots of diapers, wipes, and formula as well as clothing and furniture donations during the months of COVID. Of course, we prioritize the needs of our clients first and foremost. They can use their Baby Bucks to purchase items, and during the beginning months of COVID, we even did some free distributions of necessities to them.

However, we also wish to do our best to help non-clients in our community. When we have been blessed with an abundance of items, we do not want to hoard them, but rather bless others in need in our communities. We provide what is called, "emergency help," to people who contact us with needs. Normally we limit this to assisting families once every six months, but we have changed our policy to helping once every three months while we have a lot of supplies. Our prayer is as we minister to them with Christ's love that it will impact them spiritually as well as physically. Please feel free to refer anyone you know with these needs to us.
