When Sara\* was between 17 and 19 weeks pregnant, test results indicated a possible anomaly. She shared these results with her Client

Advocate and her interaction with her doctor, who on two occasions stated she could terminate her pregnancy. Sara said abortion had never crossed her mind - that she loves her baby and feels the "possible anomaly" is in God's hands. The following week, a newly pregnant woman called, whose doctor suggested terminating the pregnancy. I spoke with her about her circumstances, pregnancy options, and our services. Although she chose not to schedule an appointment at that time, she expressed gratitude for me taking time to speak with her.

We are here for all those like Sara – to walk beside them whatever their circumstances. Pray for us, all of the "Saras", and for doctors who will give life-affirming encouragement to pregnant women in difficult situations.

#### **Bad Medicine**

In April, the FDA lifted safety measures in prescribing the abortion pill. It was part of a drug safety program designed for medications which could cause serious




safety concerns. Clinics or physicians who wish to dispense these drugs would have to be certified with the manufacturer, required to explain how to take the drugs and report any and all complications to the FDA. The removal of these guidelines allows some women to obtain abortion pills without seeing a medical professional and some to order from unknown sources off the internet. Each state has its own guidelines. In 2016, the FDA also stopped collecting data from complications of these drugs, only those resulting in maternal deaths. Serious complications could and have occurred. An average of 5-8% of women require emergency room visits for complications. Women need to find out the facts about home chemical abortions before having one.

PMI is a great informational resource about the facts and risks and a SAFE PLACE to consider their options.
